

## Rules & Regulations

- Gift card purchase must take place in Traders Blanket in order to receive the Red Hot Credit offer.
- Must be 21 years of age or older and provide one of the following current forms of identification: valid driver's license, government photo ID, military photo ID, passport, state issued ID & NHBP Tribal ID. In the event the photo ID does not have the patron's address the following must be provided for verification: current pay stub, or current utility bill. In the event the patron's ID does not have a picture, but has the patron's current address, the patron must provide one of the following for verification: military photo ID, passport, government photo ID.
- Gift Cards are redeemable at the Hotel, Trader's Blanket, Swarovski, Pit Stop, or at any FireKeepers restaurant.
- Gift cards have no cash value, are non-refundable, and cannot be used to purchase alcoholic beverages, box office tickets, pay gratuity, or for any gaming, including Red Hot Credits, Chips or Bingo.
- Gift card purchases must take place between December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 and December 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 to be eligible for the Red Hot Credit offer.
- Maximum of five \$10 Red Hot Credit coupon redemptions per guest.
- Limit of one \$10 Red Hot Credit coupon redemption per day per guest.
- Red Hot Credit coupons expire on 06/30/2020.
- Red Hot Credits expire 60 days from issuance.
- One \$10 Red Hot Credit offer per \$100 total gift card purchase. Red Hot Credit offer will be awarded at time of purchase and gift card purchase must total at least \$100.
- No coupons will be re-printed or replaced.
- Red Hot Credits are not redeemable for cash, gratuity or alcohol.
- Gift cards are limited to a maximum value of \$500 per gift card.
- FireKeepers Casino Hotel reserves the right to deny participants, change, modify or cancel the promotion without notice.
- NHBP Tribal Council and Gaming Commission members are ineligible to participate in any promotions.
