## BAD BEAT PROMOTIONAL POOL RULES

Two dollars will be collected from any pot of \$20 or more in any raked Texas Hold'em cash game where there is a flop and a minimum of four players dealt into the hand.

- 35% will be allocated to the Bad Beat Jackpot
- 65% will be allocated to the promotional pool

The Bad Beat Jackpot will be updated daily by 10am.

**The Bad Beat Jackpot funds will be distributed into three separate Bad Beat Jackpot accounts based on the following percentages:**

60% will be added to the Primary Bad Beat Jackpot

30% will be added to the 1st Reserve

10% will be added to the 2nd Reserve

**In the event that the Primary Bad Beat Jackpot reaches \$100,000, the Bad Beat Jackpot funds will be distributed based on the following percentages:**

35% will be added to the Primary Bad Beat Jackpot

35% will be added to the 1st Reserve

30% will be added to the 2nd Reserve

**In the event that the 1st Reserve Bad Beat Jackpot reaches \$100,000, the Bad Beat Jackpot funds will be distributed based on the following percentages:**

25% will be added to the Primary Bad Beat Jackpot

25% will be added to the 1st Reserve

50% will be added to the 2nd Reserve

The Bad Beat Jackpot occurs when Four of a Kind or better is beaten assuming the following conditions have been met:

- Both hole cards of both players must play to make their best five-card hand.
- Four of a kind must have a pocket pair.
- Hand must be played to showdown with all action complete.
- Promotional drop has been collected.

Once the Bad Beat Jackpot hands have been verified, the daily posted amount will be divided as follows:

- 40% of the jackpot will be awarded to the losing hand which is defined as the second best hand.
- 20% of the jackpot will be awarded to the winning hand which is defined as the best hand.
- 40% of the jackpot will be equally divided among the remaining players that were dealt into the Bad Beat Jackpot hand.

In the event that the Bad Beat Jackpot reaches \$100,000, the distribution of the funds will include a room share to all players actively playing in a qualifying Texas Hold'em game at the time the Bad Beat Jackpot is hit. Players with missed blind buttons will not be eligible for a room share. Any active player(s) seated on the jackpot table and not dealt into the hand will be eligible for a room share if the player does not have a missed blind button. Once the primary Bad Beat Jackpot reaches \$100,000, the distribution will be as follows:

- 40% of the jackpot will be awarded to the losing hand which is defined as the second best hand.
- 20% of the jackpot will be awarded to the winning hand which is defined as the best hand.
- 20% of the jackpot will be equally divided among the remaining players that were dealt into the Bad Beat Jackpot hand.
- 20% of the jackpot will be equally divided among players in the room playing on other qualifying tables.

**The funds allocated to the promotional pool will be distributed back to the poker players through a variety of scheduled and approved promotions.**

### **RESTRICTIONS:**

- For all promotional payouts including the Bad Beat Jackpot, there must be a minimum of four (4) players dealt into the hand; a flop; and \$2 collected from a \$20 minimum pot for eligibility.
- During extended periods when promotions other than the Bad Beat Jackpot are not available, the promotional drop will be adjusted. One dollar will be collected from any pot of \$20 or more in a raked Texas Hold'em game where there is a flop and a minimum of four players dealt into the hand.
- Players may not discuss potential jackpot or bonus hand draws. Any discussion may be considered collusion and may void any jackpot or bonus pay out.
- In the event that management deems the cards in play to be fouled, all qualifying hands will be null and void.
- An agreement to "run it twice" will void jackpot and promotional pay out opportunities.
- In order to be eligible for any funds, players must be able to produce proper ID. A social security card may be necessary for certain amounts.
- Management reserves all rights.
